Juste à temps pour le début des vacances d'été, nous vous proposons une newsletter et un signe de vie de notre part. L'objectif du projet est d'offrir aux membres de notre association un soutien approprié dans le processus dynamique de numérisation du marché de l'art, afin que les petites entreprises telles que les galeries de programme traditionnelles ne se voient pas refuser l'accès aux modèles commerciaux numériques. Car il est clair pour nous que le marché de l'art ne sera pas le même après la pandémie qu'avant. Nous aspirons tous à des rencontres physiques et au plaisir de l'art, les premières foires ouvrent timidement leurs portes - mais le monde numérique restera. Et c'est exactement là que nous voulons commencer avec notre projet: les salles d'exposition numériques mais aussi des sujets tels que les rapports d'état, l'authenticité et la provenance des œuvres d'art, la

conclusion et le règlement des transactions, la prévention du blanchiment d'argent, etc. sont de plus en plus façonnés par l'utilisation de solutions numériques. Nous suivons de très près l'évolution du marché et essayons de développer des offres préférentielles attractives pour les membres de l'association.

L'état actuel des travaux dans nos **six dossiers principaux** (1.) Droit d'auteur, (2.) Prévention du blanchiment d'argent, (3.) Protection des biens culturels, (4.) Biens spoliés, (5.) Douanes et TVA, (6.) Marché de l'art divers / Numérisation / Soutien aux foires d'art peut toujours être trouvé sur notre <u>site web</u>, qui est toujours tenu à jour. Ces derniers mois, nous nous sommes bien sûr concentrés sur les effets de la crise du COVID19 sur le commerce de l'art sous toutes ses formes. Nous sommes ici en dialogue avec les autorités fédérales et cantonales ou avec Pro Helvetia, par exemple, lorsqu'il s'agit de mettre en place ou de maintenir des conditions-cadres judicieuses pour que les antiquaires, les galeristes du marché primaire, les négociants du marché secondaire et les commissaires-priseurs puissent continuer à exercer leurs activités.

Vous trouverez en annexe de cette newsletter une **enquête** courte et pragmatique, auquel nous souhaitons que vous répondiez. Notre objectif est de comprendre vos sensibilités et vos besoins - notamment en vue d'un événement physique pour nos membres, qui, nous l'espérons, aura lieu à nouveau cet automne.
